## Welcome to Year 3!

Community of Faith Mission begins its third year of providing an emergency shelter program in Williamsburg.

**Training for Shelter Host and Partner Key Leaders will be held Thursday, Oct. 23, 6:30-8:30 pm** at New Town United Methodist, 5209 Monticello Avenue (next to the courthouse).

All Hosts should send at least two Key Leaders, and Partners should send at least one. You may bring up to six, but due to space limitations we are not able to accommodate more than that.

We will use a different format in our training this year, updating you on any new policies and highlighting four key areas through rotating stations. The program will conclude with a speaker who will provide valuable insight into the lives of those who live unsheltered.

We have produced a new training video, which you may use at your own in-house training. Congregations will also receive one copy of the training manual, which you may reproduce.

**NEW to training this year is a special segment on Safety and Security.** As we approach our third season we have implemented policies and procedures to enhance the security protocol we currently have in place. We believe that our program

will be better served if each Host and Partner assigns one volunteer whose sole responsibility when working at the shelter is safety and security. This designated volunteer will have additional training to be better prepared to handle security protocol should a situation arise with a guest.

We have asked each Host and Partner to send one or two individuals to this special training on Wednesday, Oct. 22, 6:30-8:15 pm at New Town United Methodist Church. Jay Sexton, retired JCC Police Officer specializing in CIT (Crisis Intervention Team), will be the lead facilitator.
